Regardless of how long you plan on leaving your vehicle unattended.

- Cash (including change)
- Electronics (cameras, laptops, portable navigation units, and mobile phones)
- Expensive jewelry and clothing
- House and/or car keys
- Tools

ITEMS LEFT IN YOUR CAR CAN MAKE YOU VULNERABLE TO IDENTITY THEFT:

- Electronics (laptops or cell phones with personal information stored on it)
- Personal information (bank statements, credit cards, pay stubs, or social security number)
- Pocketbook or wallet
