Projected Use of CDBG-CV3 Cares Act Funds
Substantial Amendment of 2019 Annual Action Plan

This Notice serves as a Substantial Amendment to the 2019 City of Bridgeton Annual Action Plan previously approved by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development. The 2019 Annual Action Plan was approved for \$318,251 in CDBG funds. In addition the 1st Amendment to the 2019 Action Plan was recently approved to receive \$197,626 in CARES Act Community Development Block Grant -CV1 funds. Under the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (CARES Act) dated September 11, 2020, the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) has awarded the City of Bridgeton an additional \$213,874 in CDBG-CV3 Funds (Community Development Block Grant Coronavirus Funds) specifically to address the coronavirus pandemic known as COVID-19 and its affects.

The comment period for use of these funds will begin on June 21, 2021 and end on July 23, 2021 which will allow the public to make comments and suggestions regarding COVID-19 related needs and use of funds. In order to obtain the views of residents, public agencies and other interested parties, Bridgeton will place the Substantial Amendment on public display beginning June 23, 2021 on the City's website at the following address: www.cityofbridgeton.com .
